## HST Sampler Quilt <br> BLOCK \#5: Shoo-fly

Final Block Size: $12.5^{\prime \prime}$ square


The Shoo-fly Block is a very traditional block dating back from around the 1850s. It's thought to have been designed and called after a wild flower known as a clover bloom or shoo-fly. Due to the simple steps of piecing the block together, it quickly became a favourite in teaching young girls the basic steps of 9-patch block construction. *

## Measurements \& Cutting:

From the background fabric cut: x4: 4.5" squares (for the inside and outside of the rows)
\& x2: 5" squares (to be made into HSTs)
From the Mosaic print fabric cut: $\times 1$ : $4.5^{\prime \prime}$ square (for the centre)
\& x2: 5" squares (to be made into HSTs)

## Fabrics:

Background: Cotton Supreme Solid in Blue Skies by RJR Fabrics Mosaic: From the range, The Sultan's Garden by Mary McGuire for RJR Fabrics
